Drew, the Pathway to the Best Science Graduate Programs

Drew ranks 17th among liberal arts universities nationwide in the number of graduates who earn doctorate degrees in physical sciences.

National Science Foundation

This survey, done by the National Science Foundation, compiled 10 years worth of data to show the rate of students who graduated from Drew with undergraduate degrees, weighted by the number of doctorate degrees awarded per 100 students. At Drew students work hands on with instrumentation and are encouraged to get involved in undergraduate research early in their academic careers, both with Drew faculty and industrial scientists.

RISE Program

The only program in the nation of its kind, RISE gives students the opportunity to work directly along side industrial scientists in a variety of fields, from drug discovery to industrial microbiology to mathematics.

The RISE program has received the prestigious Merck Innovation Award for Undergraduate Science Education for "fresh thinking and imaginative use of resources."
